Answer sheet:

1	<p>If you really don't know someone, you should not give them any information.</p> <p>During JOTI you can tell people your first name, and town. Do not tell them any other personal contact details like; home address or your personal email address</p>
2	<p>Anyone could help you or give you advice, but if you have an issue with a user on the JOTI channels you can call one of the leaders who can help you, or you can contact a user with their nickname starting with the @ symbol. Be aware @bot-en, @ChanServ and @ScoutLink are all robots and will not respond.</p>
3	<p>ASL can mean all of the answers in question 3. For this reason do not use it during JOTI, instead ask real questions. Why not ask them what Scouting is like in their country.</p>
4	<p>Retaliation isn't the best way to deal with bullying and can often make things much worse.</p> <p>The best thing to do is ignore them and tell a leader who can help you.</p> <p>Doing nothing and ignoring them will not make the problem go away and they may well bully other users.</p>
5	<p>Flooding on IRC (Internet Relay Chat) is when a user posts messages very quickly after each other, this could be copy and pasting the same thing or typing a letter and pressing send and repeating it very quickly. This is not allowed and you will be kicked from the channel by the automated bots.</p> <p>General Online Safety</p>
6	<p>You can get help from all the answers in question six. Beat bullying offer peer support via their website, and you can speak to any of</p>

	<p>the leaders, teachers or your parents at any time for help and advice about bullying.</p>
7	<p>Always think before you click accept as a friend. Sites like Moshi Monsters and Club Penguin encourage you to make friends with others in a safe environment. On these sites you should ask them who they are if you don't know them, so you can make a decision about if you want to be their friend. On facebook and twitter it's best if you only accept friends you know in real life, but if you want to be friends with someone you don't know, try to find out more information about them, like who they are friends with etc. Remember – people can lie online, so they might not be who they say they are, and if you accept them as a friend, then they will have access to the information you post.</p>
8	<p>Computers accessing the internet should have a Firewall and an Anti Virus program installed to help protect your computer from computer viruses.</p>
9	<p>You should tell your parents or another responsible adult straight away. Don't ask the user why, or agree to keep silent. Something may not be right and you should get advice on what to do next.</p>
10	<p>Be sensible and report any problems to a responsible adult, parent or even reporting via click CEOP or to the website directly. Most websites provide reporting systems if you have problems with bullying, they can help by taking down offensive content.</p>
