4 <sup>th</sup> Mar	<p><b><u>Elearning Modules – Frequently Asked Questions</u></b></p> <p>The <a href="#">Frequently Asked Questions</a> for elearning modules have recently been updated to help learners in completing the elearning.</p> <p>A common problem has been the certificate page at the end of a module generating a blank page. This is often due to the version of the Internet browser being used or the browser settings, e.g. pop-up blockers. Learners may wish to take a screenshot of the final page instead to share with their Training Adviser when they meet to discuss the learning and validate the module.
