



The Grand Howl

When I am at Cubs, I will join in the Grand Howl at the beginning of the meeting. The Grand Howl is a special way of saying 'hello' to the leaders.

I will stand in a circle or horseshoe shape with the other Cubs. Akela (or another leader) will stand in the middle. I will listen to the leader.

The Grand Howl starts when the leader's arms are lifted up and then down.

I will squat down like the other Cubs. This is like the wolves do in The Jungle Book story, with their paws between their legs, when they are at Council Rock.

I will say our shout: **'Akela, we will do our best!'** with the other Cubs. It is OK to shout in the Grand Howl. A Sixer will then stand at alert, salute the leader and say or shout: **'Cubs! Do your best!'**

I will then stand and salute with the other Cubs, and say or shout: **'We will do our best!'**
