



Going to Scouts

I am going to Scouts. Scouts is a group for young people who are a similar age to me. The group is called a Scout Troop and the young people are called Scouts.

When someone has made their Promise, they get a special scarf to wear with their uniform. The scarf is sometimes called a Necker and is worn with a woggle. At Scouts, I can earn badges, which I can put on my uniform.
