



Making the Promise

When I have been to Scouts for a few weeks, I will decide if I want to join. I will need to make a Promise. A leader will help me to understand and choose a Promise.

Making the Promise is very important. It means I am promising to be a good Scout and to try my best.

I will say my Promise at a special ceremony called an investiture. This is called being 'invested'. Other young people may be invested at the same time as me.

At the investiture, everyone will stand in a circle or horseshoe shape. Parents or carers might come to watch.

The leader will ask me if I understand the Promise. Then, I will make the Scout sign and say my Promise. If I feel nervous, this is OK. I can tell the leader and they can help me.

After making my Promise, I will get a special badge. I will get a special scarf (also called a necker) to wear at Scouts. I will also get a woggle to wear with it.
